MAPLETON MUSIC BOOSTERS DANCE CAMP AND STATE FAIR SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, the Mapleton Music Boosters offers \$50.00 scholarships to high school students who are planning to participate in dance camp (as a member of the Sweethearts Dance Team), or Ohio State Fair band or choir. These scholarships are intended to help defray some of the costs for students and their families. The maximum number of scholarships available each academic year is six, for a total of \$300 in available scholarship money.

SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES -

All scholarship materials must be submitted to band/choir director before May 20th.

A. Essay

- 1. Essay should be less than one page, typed.
- 2. Include why you want to attend dance camp or State Fair band/choir.
- 3. Include why you would like to receive the scholarship.

B. Selection Process

- 1. Essays will be read by someone outside of the Music Program.
- 2. Essays readings will be "blind" the reader(s) will not be given the applicant(s) names, and will not know who wrote each essay.
- 3. Winners will be selected by the June meeting of the Boosters, and announced shortly thereafter.

C. Claiming Scholarship Funds

- 1. Following camp, winners of Dance Camp Scholarships will be asked to attend a Boosters meeting to give a brief report on what they learned and how they will use what they learned. Boosters will then reimburse the Sweethearts for the \$50 scholarship per winner.
- 2. Winners of the Ohio State Fair band and/or choir Scholarship will be asked to attend a Boosters meeting to give a brief report on what they learned and how they will use what they learned. Boosters will then reimburse each student for the \$50 scholarship.

MAPLETON MUSIC BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIPS

The Mapleton Music Boosters offers two \$250.00 Scholarships every school year to Mapleton High School Seniors who have completed at least three years of High School Band and/or Choir. One scholarship will be awarded to an Instrumental student, and one to a Vocal student. Applicants must be enrolled in a music class at Mapleton during the academic year in which they apply. Students are not required to be a future college music major to apply.

The objective of the scholarship is to reward Mapleton Music students for their musicianship, participation, positive attitude, leadership, and devotion to the Music Program at Mapleton High School.

SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES –

All written scholarship materials must be submitted to band/choir director before the day of District X Solo Contest (see Section A, Item 3)

A. Solo

- 1. Solos must be selected from the current edition of the Ohio Music Education Association (OMEA) Solo and Ensemble Adjudicated Event Required Music Catalog. Solo selections must also be approved by the band/choir director.
- 2. Solos must be a Class A or B.
- 3. Solos must be performed at the OMEA District X Solo and Ensemble Adjudicated Event in the same academic year as application, and receive a rating of I, II, or III.
- 4. If the OMEA Solo Event is cancelled due to inclement weather, the Boosters and faculty will make alternative arrangements, per majority vote.

B. Typed Essay

Include the following points (please limit to high school only):

E. Selection of Winners

- 1. Judges will select winners immediately following the audition process.
- 2. A winner will be selected for each of the two categories: Instrumental and Vocal.
- 3. If no qualifying students apply for either scholarship, no scholarship will be awarded for that category.
- 4. Winner(s) will be announced at the High School Music Awards Banquet held in the Spring.

F. Claiming Scholarship Funds

- 1. Winners may claim scholarship funds upon completion of one semester of college or technical school.
- 2. A copy of the first semester's transcript must be provided to the Boosters in order to receive funds. Students' GPA must be a 2.5 or above during their first semester of college in order to claim their scholarship.
- 3. Upon receiving the above documentation, Boosters will issue a \$250.00 check directly to the student.
- 4. Students are reminded that the scholarship must be used within two years from the date of the Banquet in which the scholarship was awarded to the student.
- 5. It is the student's responsibility to contact the Music Boosters with the proper documentation to claim their scholarship. Failure to claim the funds within two years (per above), will result in a forfeiture of the scholarship.
